

COPY WILL OF THOMAS HAWKES SON OF TIMOTHY AND ANNE 1632-1695

In the name of god amen according to the computation of the church of England

Of the said Thomas Hawkes of Grafton Underwood in the county of Northamptonshire of perfect noliq and remembrance do make and ordayne my last will and testament the fourth day of September in the year of our lord one thousand six hundred ninety and five in the seventh year of his majesties rein in the manner and form following.

First I do give and bequeath my sole unto the hands of almighty god my maker and redeemer hoping for free pardon of all my sins and for my body to be buried in Christian burial at the discretion of my executors hereinafter named.

Item I give to my son Thomas Hawkes ten quarters of barley and ten? Of wheat

A year to be paid for four years together between mikel and lady day.

Item I give to my son Mathew Hawkes the sum of twenty pounds to be paid at the age of three and twenty years.

Item I give to my daughter Coalsman the sum of one shillon.

Item I give to my daughter Anne Molton the sum of five pounds.

Item I give to my daughter Mary Hawkes the sum of ten pounds to be paid at the age of five and twenty years.

I tem I give to my daughter Reboskon Hawkes the sum of ten pounds to be paid at the age of five and twenty years.

Item I give to my son William Hawkes y bed and bedding and the great table in the house and the molt mill and the rest of the household goods in the house I give to Elizabeth my wife to be at her disposing.

Item I give to my son John Hawkes to sum of five pounds to be paid five years after my decease.

Item my will is that Elizabeth my wife, William Hawkes my son be joint executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby appoint them so and jointly to pay all my debts.

Item my will is that if therebe hereafter a partition made of my goods and chattels by consent of my wife and my son William then my son William shall have ten pounds more than a moiety of my goods and chattels and my will further is that if my wife Elizabeth do dye before a partition of my goods and chattels be made by my executors then my son William shall have ten pounds more then a moiety thereof in consideration of some cattell given me by him at the present making of this my last will and testament
