Farmer's Bravery The British Empire Medal has been awarded to Mr James Ingledew, a farmer, of Street Farm, near Hackforth, Yorkshire, for his bravery in attempting to rescue the pilot of Spitfire which crashed at high speed and burst into flames in November, 1940. He found the pilot lying with his head in the wreckage, his body enveloped in flames. With ammunition exploding in every direction, Mr Ingledew pulled the pilot clear and removed him to a safe distance. Unfortunately the pilot was already dead.
