Mary Anne did not seem to have much luck in life, she first married Charles Johnson and was living at Earls Barton on the 1881 census, and then Charles dies soon after leaving her a widow.

Mary Anne married again to Joseph Berrill in 1888 and on the 1891 census she is living with him at Castle Cottages in Wellingborough and they are living close by to her widowed mother and her siblings who were living at Swanspool.

Mary Ann is found in the records for Berrywood Mental Hospital in Dec 1900 and then discharged recovered on March 21st 1901

On the 1901 census she is living with her widowed mother Mary Hawkes at Castle Cottages and she is herself a widow again by this time Joseph having died in the March qtr. of 1899 (perhaps this would explain her mental breakdown)

On the death certificate of her brother George Hawkes in 1904 Mary-Anne is listed as informant and her address is being given as 71 Gold St Wellingborough.

On the 1911 Census she is living at Rose Cottages Sheep Street Wellingborough and her occupation is listed as Caretaker.

Mary Anne dies in Wellingborough in 1937.
