HER MAJESTY is graciously pleased to grant to

convicted of *Shooting with intent to do grievous bodily harm*
at the *Assizes holden at Northampton* in and
for the *County of Northampton*
on the *20th* day of *March 1878*, and was then and there
sentenced to be kept in Penal Servitude for the term of *five years*
and is now confined in the

Portland Convict Prison

HER ROYAL LICENCE to be at large from the day of his Liberation under
this Order during the remaining portion of his said term of Penal Servitude,
unless the said

Thomas Hawkes

shall,

before the expiration of the said term, be convicted of some indictable Offence
within the United Kingdom, in which case such Licence will be immediately
forfeited by Law, or unless it shall please Her Majesty sooner to revoke or
alter such Licence.

This Licence is given subject to the Conditions endorsed upon the
same, upon the breach of any of which it will be liable to be revoked whether
such breach is followed by a Conviction or not.

And Her Majesty hereby orders that the said

Thomas Hawkes

be set at liberty within Thirty days from the date of this Order.
